

Hello Everyone,


Welcome back after what we hope was a lovely half term break.

In Literacy this week we looked at the phonic sound sh and revised the sounds s a t with children that need to practice their first sounds a bit more. The sound sh is for ship and the action is putting your 2 hands together in a side ways prayer motion and moving them up and down like a ship sailing on the sea. We read a new class book called How Bear Lost his Tail. This will be our book of the fortnight and our work will be based around it. We started off looking at what an adjective is and came up with an alphabet of describing words as a whole class. They were fabulous at this and could think of some impressive words. We also looked at what a simile is and wrote 2 similes about either hot or cold things.

E.G. As cold as ice

or

As hot as lava.



In our maths we looked at ordinal numbers – first, second, third, fourth, fifth and last, circling objects in a line when given an instruction. Some of this language was new to many of the children and any chance to use it at home would be of great help to them. We also looked at non-standard measurement and used our fingers, hand span, feet and leg strides to estimate and then measure things around the classroom.

In P.E. we got out some netballs and practiced our hand/eye co-ordination skills by throwing, bouncing, rolling and kicking the balls to a partner.

In Welsh we practiced our numbers by playing Welsh number Bingo to 10.

In our outdoor learning we used our number skills to solve addition sums. We were given a sum and had to work out the answer then find the number card answer up near the Round House to show to Mrs Davies.

Finally, it was lovely to celebrate St David's Day on Monday and the children made us all very proud with their fantastically enthusiastic renditions of Colours of the Rainbow in Welsh with sign language and the song Mr Hapus. We were the BEST!
